HAUTIER FAMILY CEMETERY, LYTTON, BC

HAUTIER FAMILY CEMETERY, LYTTON, BC

(Published in the BC Genealogist, Vol 34, No 4, December 2005, p 182 ©BCGS)

Situated approximately 2 miles south of Lytton on benchland now owned by Lytton (formerly Spatium) Lumber Ltd. And visible from highway 1 about 100 yards to the west. The graves are enclosed within a fence composed of concrete posts joined by metal rails.

Louis and Josephine Hautier built and managed Lytton's first hotel, the Globe. An article about the Hautier Family Cemetery appearing in the Lytton Museum's Newsletter, (July 2003 Issue 4, Number 2, p 3) noted that in 1882, after his wife's death, Louis Hautier had this two acre area designated as a "family sepulcher and burial ground". Lytton village looks after this cemetery, but it is on private property. Due to this and because of safety concerns, permission is needed to visit it.
