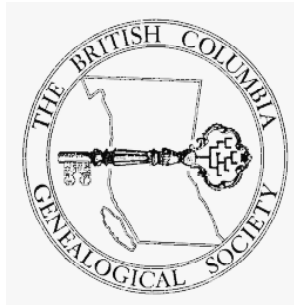

## MOYIE CEMETERY, MOYIE, BC

The 25 legible grave markers were copied on October 1, 1968 in a small cemetery on Highway #3, about two miles south of Moyie, BC.

Located off the shoulder of Highway #3 on a bush and tree covered slope, no fence described its boundaries. Most plots were enclosed by once-white picket fences. There were many wooden markers, the inscriptions erased by erosion, standing alone unfenced, each supported by a stout stick. The picket fences surrounding some of the plots were tumbling in upon unmarked graves. Other more substantial markers were surrounded by iron fences.

The highway once afforded access to this cemetery but in recent years was regarded and widened. Now one must park his car on the built-up shoulder of the roadway, then scramble down the embankment and walk in through the tall grass and brush.

The cemetery was not being cared for at the time the inscriptions were being copied and to all appearances had been abandoned. The most recent burial was in 1955 the earliest burial recorded in 1902. the earliest birthdate inscribed was 1830.

## MOYIE CEMETERY, MOYIE, BC

The following is an excerpt from a letter from Mrs. Mirth Hall of the Seattle Genealogical Society.

The cemetery is not too visible from the Highway 3, about two miles south of Moyie, BC.

Located off the shoulder of Highway 3 on a brush and tree covered slope, no fence described its boundaries. Most plots were enclosed by once-white picket fences. There were many wooden markers, the inscriptions erased by erosion, standing alone, unfenced, each supported by a stout stick.
